**VARANASI:** Renowned business school in the region School of Management Sciences (SMS), Varanasi completed its 16 years of existence on November 10, 2011. The Institution celebrated its 17th Foundation Day "Adharshila" amidst joyous fervor and competitive spirit with 12 teams participating in the day long competitive events covering four events in academic and cultural arenas. A traditional 'puja' was performed at the Campus in the early morning hours before the arrival of the Chief Guest. The Chief Guest in the inaugural session was Honorable Prof. Kripa Shankar, Vice Chancellor, Gautama Buddha Technical University, Lucknow.

Inaugurating the day-long event "Adharshila 2011" at SMS Campus, Prof. Kripa Shankar said that knowledge is the purpose of education to ameliorate the society.
